



Hazard Mitigation Plan

Public Survey Results Summary

Between 12 July and 25 August 2023, almost 90 surveys were completed. Most respondents (81%) indicated that they are CVWD customers. The complete survey and detailed results will be included in Appendix C of the Hazard Mitigation Plan (when available). Highlights are summarized as follows:

- Responses were received for the English (85) and Spanish (2) surveys
- Surveys were received from 12 communities in the service area and the unincorporated areas of Riverside County
- Most respondents indicated that they had been impacted by extreme heat (79%)
- The hazards of greatest threat include Earthquake (86% of respondents), extreme heat (74%), energy shortage/power failure (47%), and drought (44%)
- Respondents agree that the District should equally pursue all six risk reduction activities:
 - Prevention
 - Property Protection
 - Natural Resource Protection
 - Structural Projects
 - Emergency Services
 - Public Education and Awareness
- Nearly 90% of respondents indicated that they are extremely or somewhat concerned about impacts from climate change with extended drought and increased heat of highest concern
- Internet and social media were indicated as the most effective way for community members to receive hazard information (67%), followed by email (59%) and television (49%).
